Statewide Funding Priorities for use by the Commission in developing the 2025-2027 Biennial Public Postsecondary Operating Budget Recommendations

Gary Timm, Finance Officer, presented the four statewide budget priorities identified for the upcoming biennium: initiatives that respond to identified educational and workforce development needs in Nebraska, initiatives that increase college enrollment, initiatives that make postsecondary education more affordable, and initiatives that increase the postsecondary retention and graduation rates. Mr. Timm's report included background information on the budget process and listed the Commission's Statewide Budget Priorities History from 1995-1997 through the current proposed years of 2025-2027. If approved, these issues and initiatives will be communicated to the public institutions through the operating and state aid budget request outline procedures.

Committee Recommendation: The Budget, Construction, and Financial Aid Committee recommends approval of the Statewide Funding Priorities for the 2025-2027 Biennial Budget Process.

<u>Guidelines – Career-Readiness and Dual-Credit Education Grant</u> Program

J. Ritchie Morrow, Financial Aid Officer, presented the program guidelines, noting that the purpose of the Career-Readiness and Dual-Credit Education Grant Program is to provide tuition and fees for a teacher employed by a high school who is pursuing undergraduate or graduate course work, a faculty member currently employed by a postsecondary institution seeking a teaching permit, or an individual seeking to teach in a career or technical field who will be employed by a high school or two-year institution. The start date of the program is July 1, 2024, with application materials becoming available May 1, 2024.

Committee Recommendation: That the Commission approve the Career-Readiness and Dual-Credit Education Grant Program Guidelines as presented in the document and authorize Commission staff to make updates and adjustments to the Guidelines as necessary.

Commissioner Lauritzen, on behalf of the Budget, Construction, and Financial Aid Committee, moved to approve the Guidelines for the Career-Readiness and Dual-Credit Education Grant Program. A roll call vote was taken. Voting aye: Daniels, Frison, Griffin, Headrick, Lauritzen, Nelson, Von Behren, Weber, and Wilson. The motion carried.

<u>Guidelines – Door to College Scholarship</u>

Mr. Morrow presented the Door to College Scholarship, stating the purpose of this program is to provide financial assistance to undergraduate students enrolled at a Nebraska postsecondary institution who had been placed in a Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Center (YRTC) and graduated from the YRTC or their home school. The student will be able to apply for up to \$5,000 assistance per year for full-time students; for a part-time student, the amount will be prorated. The program starts July 1, 2024, and application materials will be released April 1, 2024.

Committee Recommendation: That the Commission approve the proposed Door to College Scholarship Program Guidelines as presented in the document and authorize Commission staff to make updates and adjustments to the Guidelines as necessary.

Commissioner Lauritzen, on behalf of the Budget, Construction, and Financial Aid Committee, moved to approve the Guidelines for the Door to College Scholarship. A roll call vote was taken. <u>Prioritization Process for Capital Construction Budget Requests –</u> 2025-2027 Biennium

Matthew Roque, Capital Project & Financial Analyst, presented the prioritization process for the next biennium. The Commission is responsible by statute to develop a unified prioritization of individual capital construction budget requests for which it has recommended approval. Those priorities

will be submitted to the Governor and the Legislature for their consideration. Mr. Roque noted there are ten criteria used within the prioritization process and a facilities category rankings table that is used in developing capital construction budget requests.

Mr. Timm, Mr. Morrow, and Dr. Baumgartner continue to meet weekly with the Nebraska Department of Education staff and their application developers who are building the application and tracking system for the Excellence in Teaching loan forgiveness program. Joe Velasquez, Database Manager, is developing the application system for the Career-Readiness and Dual-Credit Education Grant. Mr. Morrow plans to attend the Nebraska Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators meeting next week and will participate in EducationQuest's biennial symposium on April 16. Dr. David Jackson, Vice Provost for the University of Nebraska, spoke in support of the three new program proposals from the University of Nebraska institutions on the agenda.

Ricketts Great Books College, Omaha - Application for a Recurrent Authorization to Operate - Administrative Office Only

Dr. Fimple presented the proposal, stating the core of the curriculum is to focus on the great books. The program has developed videos that precede the instruction, which will be entirely online. To make getting a degree more affordable, the Ricketts "Harder You Work Scholarship" program would refund up to 80% of a student's tuition each semester upon successful completion of the semester's courses.

- 2) financial statements are included with the required annual reports, and
- 3) Ricketts Great Books College complies with the assessment and surety bond requirements of Neb. Rev. Stat. §85-2423 through §85-2427, with a surety bond or other security agreement of \$20,000 to remain in effect until the Guaranty Recovery Cash fund reaches the minimal fund level, currently \$250,000.

The program would be offered online. Students are required to have a master's degree with 3 years of experience or 5 years of experience without a master's degree. Dr. Fimple noted there is no doctor of practice degree in nutrition and dietetics in Nebraska.

Committee Recommendation: That the Commission approve the Doctor of Nutrition and Dietetics degree at the University of Nebraska Medical Center.

2024 Nebraska Higher Education Progress Report

Ms. Heese presented PowerPoint slides of the Progress Report. She stated there are three key priorities the Commission is required to evaluate in the report: increase the number of students who enter postsecondary education in Nebraska; increase the percentage of students who persist and successfully complete a degree; and reduce, eliminate, and reverse the net out-migration of Nebraskans with high levels of educational attainment.

Ms. Heese noted what is new in the 2024 report and provided details on the three priorities. Given the findings of the report, more work needs to be done for Nebraskans to enroll in college and complete degrees. Dr. Baumgartner discussed the recommendations for improvement at the high school, postsecondary, and state government levels listed in the report.

Committee Recommendation: That the Commission approve the 2024 Nebraska Higher Education Progress Report.

Description

The proposed degree program is a revision of the four existing BA/BS degrees listed above. It is designed to give students a broader education in the media areas of corporate and persuasive communication, social media strategies, media production on all platforms, writing, storytelling techniques, and design. The fields of study of the four existing degree programs would become areas of emphasis with a rebranding to better match the content of the program and the terminology of the industry.

The curriculum would consist of 120 semester credit hours. The foundation for the major is the Media Studies 15 credit hour core in communication software, media writing, audio production, video production, and communication law. Students then select one of the four emphases, consisting of 47 credit hours of coursework specific to the area. Requirements include a graduation portfolio website presented to faculty prior to graduation. (See page 4 for the curriculum and the revised names of the program areas of emphasis.) There are also 30-31 hours of general education and 27-28 hours of open electives.

UNK reports that a search for "media" on Indeed.com displayed eight local jobs that students would qualify for with titles such as Anchor, Reporter, Multimedia Journalist, and Communications Specialist. The

term 'sports communication' listed jobs in Kearney, Hastings, Lincoln, and Omaha. Nationally, a 'sports media' search resulted in over 6,700 jobs and another 13,000 jobs under the term "multimedia." Jobs were in numerous industries including public schools, universities, and the Navy. UNK states that they currently have two such multimedia positions unfilled on campus. According to the proposal, one of the largest growing areas is video. Indeed.com has over 16,000 jobs nationwide listed under the term "video.

Since there is not one distinct occupation tied to the field of media studies, analysis of need is difficult. The proposal documents the need for employees nationally with less detail on local need. The wide range of potential jobs, however, suggests that there would be a need for program graduates in the UNK region.

UNK also states that there is a benefit to the university by creating the new program. It would streamline the existing programs and improve the ability to make better use of course offerings and effective use of faculty expertise. It would also unite students with common interests and skills, creating a strong community and greater opportunity for students to interact with faculty and other students who have similar skillsets and interests.



were 35 full-time advertising/public relations majors, 13 full-time journalism majors, 25 full-time multimedia majors, and 17 full-time sports communication majors. These four majors together averaged 20 graduates per year from 2019 to 2023.

In addition to the existing students in the four program areas, UNK expects to enroll four new students in year two and four additional students each subsequent year for a total of 16 in year five.

College, and Nebraska Wesleyan University. Chadron State College has a Communication Arts major with emphasis areas in interpersonal communication, media production, journalism, and public relations. Wayne State also has a program called Mass Communication with emphasis areas in electronic media, journalism, sports media, agricultural communication/leadership, and digital film production/theory.

More specific programs are offered by UNO, with a BA and BS degree in Journalism and Media Communication with emphasis areas in public relations/advertising and emerging media. UNL offers Bachelor of Journalism degrees in Broadcasting, Journalism, and Sports Media/Communication. UNK contends that the UNO and UNL programs are not as focused on serving students from rural areas or first-generation college students as the proposed program.

The programs at Chadron and Wayne are most like the proposed program in that they provide a single, generalist core and options in more specific areas within the broad major. Both

Chadron and Wayne have more options than the proposed program with a wider range, including interpersonal communication, agricultural communication, and digital film production. With all the options included, Wayne graduated a total of 22 students in the most recent three years and Chadron graduated 21—an average of about seven graduates per year for each.

Chadron and Wayne are serving areas of the state far distant from Kearney and appear to be adequately supporting their individual programs. The proposed program would not be an unnecessary duplication.

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


Key Takeaways Degrees and Other Awards Conferred 2012-2013 through 2022-2023

- In 2022-23, 31,492 degrees and awards were conferred by Nebraska's postsecondary institutions, a decrease of 935 (2.9%), from one year earlier. Over the 10-year period from 2012-13 to 2022-23, the total number of awards conferred increased 1.7%.
 - Over the last year, awards increased at the state colleges (0.6%) and the community colleges (2.6%) but decreased at the University of Nebraska (1.2%) and the nonpublic institutions (9.5%).
 - Over the last decade, the number of awards increased at the University of Nebraska (12.9%), Nebraska's state colleges (13.0%), and Nebraska's community colleges (2.1%). Meanwhile, awards decreased 11.5% at the nonpublic institutions.
- Between 2012-13 and 2022-23, the number of degrees and other awards conferred increased at all award levels except for associate's degrees.
 - Nearly half of all awards conferred are bachelor's degrees.
 - Less-than-four-year certificates was the only award category to report an increase over the last year (8.0%).
 - The highest rate of growth between 2012-13 and 2022-23 was at the doctor's level (30.8%).
- Similar to trends seen in enrollments, more awards are granted to females than to males. In 2022-23, 56.2% of awards were granted to females. However, over the last decade, awards granted to males increased at a higher rate (2.4%) compared to females (1.2%).
- In 2022-23, White non-Hispanics accounted for 73.6% of awards (compared to 83.3% in 2012-13). Since 2012-13, Nebraska has reported increases in the number of awards conferred to Asian/Pacific Islanders (55.8%), Hispanics (149.2%), multi-racial individuals (169.8%), and U.S. Nonresidents (10.3%). Meanwhile the number of awards conferred decreased for Black non-Hispanics (3.2%), Native Americans (21.1%), and White non-Hispanics (9.0%).
- Nebraska's postsecondary institutions confer large numbers of degrees and other awards in Business and Communication (21.3%); Health (18.8%); and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) (17.7%). Together, these discipline clusters accounted for 57.8% of awards conferred in 2022-23.
 - Between 2012-13 and 2022-23, the number of awards conferred decreased for the following discipline clusters: Arts and Humanities (12.0%), Business and Communication (3.8%), Health (1.8%), and Social and Behavioral Sciences and Human Services (7.1%). Meanwhile, the number of awards increased for Education (0.7%), STEM (28.5%), and Trades (10.1%).
- Compared to baseline, 2022-23 completers were more likely to be 24 years of age or younger (2012-13=45.8%, 2022-23=54.4%).





- Nebraska's public and nonpublic institutions awarded 17,706 degrees and other awards to women in 2022-23, an increase of 1.2% over the 10-year period from 2012-13 to 2022-23. The largest 10-year percentage increase for awards granted to females was seen at the doctoral degree level (51.2%).
- Meanwhile, 13,786 degrees and other awards were granted to men in 2022-23, an increase of 2.4% since 2012-13. The largest 10-year percentage increase for awards granted to males was seen at the less-than-four-year certificate level (46.3%).

- Nebraska's postsecondary institutions confer large numbers of degrees and other awards in Business and Communication; Health; and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM). Together, these discipline clusters accounted for 57.8% of awards conferred in 2022-23.
- As shown in the table below, the largest 10-year percentage increase, 28.5%, was evidenced within the STEM discipline cluster, while the largest 10-year percentage decrease, 12.0%, was evidenced within the Arts and Humanities discipline cluster.







- Section 6 of this report examines the number of completers by age group.
- In 2012-13, 45.8% of completers were 24 years of age or younger, 41.2% were 25-39 years, and 13.0% were 40 years or older.
- In 2022-23, 54.4% of completers were 24 years of age or younger, 35.1% were 25-39 years, and 10.5% were 40 years or older.
- Since 2011-12, the number of completers 24 years of age or younger has increased 21.8%. Meanwhile, the number of completers 25-39 years and 40 years or older have decreased 12.5% and 16.7%, respectively.
- As shown in the graph below, the majority of undergraduate completers in 2022-23 were 24 years or younger while the majority
 of graduate completers were 25-39 years of age.

Introduction Degrees and Other Awards Conferred 2012-2013 through 2022-2023

The 2024 Factual Look at Higher Education in Nebraska summarizes information from the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) survey forms. The Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, requires institutions that participate in federal student aid programs to submit data to IPEDS.¹

The Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education is responsible for verification and reporting of IPEDS data as defined in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 85-1424, which states:

"The commission shall:

- (1) Review and verify all information submitted by public postsecondary systems and institutions as part of the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System and make such corrections in the submitted information as are necessary; and
- (2) Prepare and disseminate an annual report of the information submitted by each public postsecondary system and institution and those private postsecondary educational institutions willing to cooperate as part of the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System."

The annual report consists of two sections—Degrees and Other Awards Conferred, and Enrollment—and each section is approved and disseminated as it is completed. This section of the *Factual Look* summarizes the number of degrees and awards reported through IPEDS surveys of Nebraska's public and nonpublic colleges and universities.

Institutions report the number of degrees and other awards conferred during a one-year period beginning on July 1. For example, degrees and awards reported for 2022-23 were awarded between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023. The 10-year trends presented in this section of the *Factual Look* are based on the Fall 2013 through Fall 2023 IPEDS Completion surveys of Nebraska's public and nonpublic colleges. Through these surveys, Nebraska institutions reported the number of degrees, certificates, and diplomas awarded from 2012-13 through 2022-23. In this report, the number of degrees and other awards conferred is analyzed by (1) sector and institution, (2) award level, (3) gender, (4) race/ethnicity, and (5) discipline cluster. In addition, the number of completers by age is summarized in section six of this report.

Throughout this report, the total number of degrees and other awards is analyzed by four sectors of higher education in Nebraska. As defined in the Coordinating Commission's *Comprehensive Statewide Plan for Postsecondary Education*, there are three public sectors of higher education in Nebraska:

¹ A few nonpublic institutions are not included in this analysis because: 1.) The institution is not required to report school statistics to IPEDS, or 2.) The institution reports school statistics to IPEDS, but it has campuses in multiple states and reports combined data for multiple campuses (known as "parent/child" reporting).



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<u>University of Nebraska</u>: "The University of Nebraska provides extensive, comprehensive postsecondary education to Nebraska citizens through its four campuses: the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, the University of Nebraska at Omaha, the University of Nebraska at Kearney, and the University of Nebraska Medical Center. The two-year Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture, under the management of the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources at UNL, is also part of the University of Nebraska system."²


<u>Nebraska State College System</u>: "The state colleges at Chadron, Peru, and Wayne are regional institutions that provide educational programs and public services to meet needs indigenous to their service areas."

<u>Nebraska Community Colleges</u>: "Community colleges provide educational options for students seeking entry-level career training. The education program may culminate in an applied technology associate degree, diploma, or certificate; or an associate of arts or associate of science degree from an academic transfer program." Nebraska's six public community colleges are: Central, Metropolitan, Mid-Plains, Northeast, Southeast, and Western Nebraska.

In addition to the public colleges and universities, private not-for-profit, private for-profit, out-of-state public, and federally-funded tribal colleges submit data to IPEDS and are categorized as <u>Nonpublic Colleges and Universities</u>. Several institutions in this sector no longer report to IPEDS due to school closings and institutional changes.



² The numbers of degrees reported include degrees conferred by the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) to graduates of the physician assistant military and distance education programs. These programs serve all branches of the military and most graduates are not residents of Nebraska. For technical reasons, UNMC did not report these students via the IPEDS Completion surveys prior to 2012-13. UNMC began reporting distance education completions in the 2012-13 IPEDS Completion surveys; however, physician assistant military completions are not reported. To ensure the *Factual Look* accurately portrays UNMC's completions, the Commission includes the physician assistant military degrees and distance education degrees in the *Degrees and Other Awards Conferred* section of the *Factual Look*. Unfortunately, the Commission is not able to determine UNMC's enrollment counts for these programs. Therefore, the *Enrollment* section of the *Factual Look* does not include students in the aforementioned programs. The number of degrees added to UNMC's IPEDS completion totals are as follows: 311 (2012-13), 344 (2013-14), 348 (2014-15), 330 (2015-16), 334 (2016-17), 358 (2017-18), 353 (2018-19), 364 (2019-20), 394 (2020-21), 394 (2021-22), and 372 (2022-23).






TOTAL DEGREES AND OTHER AWARDS CONFERRED by SECTOR








• Western Nebraska reported the large increase in awards conferred in 2021-22 was due to increases in female enrollment/completion and credentialing per student (stacking). Comparing data for completions (awards=546) to completers (students=248), it appears stacking was the overwhelming contributor. Stacking was not prevalent for 2022-23, as demonstrated by comparing completions (awards = 235) to completers (students = 235).



DEGREES AND OTHER AWARDS CONFERRED BY NEBRASKA NONPUBLIC INSTITUTIONS





TOTAL DEGREES AND OTHER AWARDS CONFERRED by AWARD LEVEL






DEGREES AND OTHER AWARDS CONFERRED BY NEBRASKA COMMUNITY COLLEGES by AWARD LEVEL










DEGREES AND OTHER AWARDS CONFERRED BY NEBRASKA NONPUBLIC INSTITUTIONS by AWARD LEVEL






DEGREES AND OTHER AWARDS CONFERRED by AWARD LEVEL by SECTOR




DOCTOR'S DEGREES AWARDED by CLASSIFICATION by SECTOR

 - 7.2% increase at the University of Nebraska (from 388 to 416)
 - 1,871.4% increase at Nebraska's nonpublic institutions (from 7 to 138)
- Professional practice doctoral degrees increased 22.5% during this same time:
 - 8.1% increase at the University of Nebraska (from 433 to 468)
 - 31.9% increase at Nebraska's nonpublic institutions (from 667 to 880)




Total Degrees and Other Awards by Gender







TOTAL DEGREES AND OTHER AWARDS by GENDER

- Nebraska's postsecondary institutions awarded 17,706 degrees, diplomas, and certificates to women in 2022-23, a one-year decrease of 5.2%. Over the 10-year period from 2012-13 to 2022-23, the total number of degrees and other awards granted to women increased 1.2%.
- Meanwhile, 13,786 degrees and other awards were granted to men in 2022-23, a one-year increase of 0.2%. Between 2012-13 and 2022-23, the total number of degrees and other awards granted to men increased 2.4%.
- While the gender gap varied slightly from one year to another, women consistently earned higher percentages of the degrees and other awards conferred by Nebraska postsecondary institutions than men. Over the last 10 years, the gap decreased from 13.0 percentage points in 2012-13 to 12.4 percentage points in 2022-23.












CLASSIFICATION OF RACE/ETHNICITY

The analyses in this section are based on the number of degrees and other awards conferred by race/ethnicity.

"Race/ethnicity: Categories developed in 1997 by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) that are used to describe groups to which individuals belong, identify with, or belong in the eyes of the community. The categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. The designations are used to categorize U.S. citizens, residents, and other eligible non-citizens. Individuals are asked to first designate ethnicity as: Hispanic or Latino or Not Hispanic or Latino. 


TOTAL DEGREES AND OTHER AWARDS CONFERRED by KNOWN and UNKNOWN RACE/ETHNICITY

- Nebraska's postsecondary institutions awarded 30,635 degrees, diplomas, and certificates to students of known race/ethnicity in 2022-23, a one-year decrease of 785 students (2.5%). Over the 10-year period from 2012-13 to 2022-23, the number of degrees and awards granted to students of known race/ethnicity increased 3.0%.
- Meanwhile, 857 degrees and other awards were granted to students of unknown race/ethnicity in 2022-23, a one-year decrease of 14.9%. Between 2012-13 and 2022-23, the number of degrees and other awards conferred to students of unknown race/ethnicity decreased 28.5%.






Nebraska Community Colleges - Degrees and Awards by Award Level by Race/Ethnicity



CLASSIFICATION OF INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS (CIP) CODES DISCIPLINE CLUSTERS

The analyses in this section are based on the number of degrees and other awards conferred by discipline cluster.

"Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP): A taxonomic coding scheme for secondary and postsecondary instructional programs. It is intended to facilitate the organization, collection, and reporting of program data using classifications that capture the majority of reportable data. The CIP is the accepted federal government statistical standard on instructional program classifications and is used in a variety of education information surveys and databases."

"CIP Code: A six-digit code in the form xx.xxxx that identifies instructional program specialties within educational institutions." (Data source: IPEDS Glossary)

CIP codes are updated approximately every 10 years by the National Center for Education Statistics. Beginning with the collection of awards for the 2019-20 academic year, IPEDS implemented the use of 2020 CIP codes. Since the *Factual Look* report focuses on discipline clusters for analyses, the only substantive change that affected Nebraska institutions is that veterinary-related programs are now reported under CIP 1 (agricultural/animal/plant/veterinary science and related fields) rather than CIP 51 (health professions and related programs). This change means that the veterinary-related programs are coded under the STEM discipline cluster, rather than the Health discipline cluster, beginning with awards conferred in 2019-20.

The following discipline clusters are based on the two-digit CIP codes defined by the National Center for Education Statistics.

TOTAL DEGREES AND OTHER AWARDS CONFERRED by DISCIPLINE CLUSTER by AWARD LEVEL



CLASSIFICATION OF AGE GROUP

The analyses in this section are based on the number of students who earned awards by age group.1

Unlike the preceding sections of this report, which analyze the number of degrees and other awards conferred, the analyses in this section focus on the number of completers who received degrees by award level.

"Completer: A student who receives a degree, diploma, certificate, or other recognized postsecondary credential. In order to be considered a completer, the degree/award must actually be conferred." (Data source: IPEDS Glossary)

<u>Each student is counted only once per award level.</u> For example, if a student is awarded two bachelor's degrees, the student is only counted once. If a student is awarded an associate's degree and a bachelor's degree, that student is counted once at the associate's level and once at the bachelor's level.

Another important distinction between Sections 1 through 5 and Section 6 is that IPEDS award levels are consolidated for data collected on age groups. As outlined on pages 2.2 and 2.3, IPEDS currently utilizes 12 award levels for data collected on the number of awards. However, for data collected on the number of completers, IPEDS utilizes only eight award levels. As outlined in the following table, the notable differences between the awards levels are 1.) Postbaccalaureate and post-master's certificates are reported as one category for age group data (prohibiting the Commission from collapsing bachelor's degrees with postbaccalaureate certificates and collapsing master's degrees with post-master's certificates), and 2.) Research/scholarship, professional practice, and other doctoral degrees are reported as one category for age group data (prohibiting the Commission from analyzing doctoral degrees by classification).






COMPLETERS by AGE GROUP by AWARD LEVEL






